OVER 500 VOLUNTEERS TO PROVIDE CRITICAL HEALTH AND SAFETY-RELATED REPAIRS AT HOME AND COMMUNITY FACILITY SITES ACROSS SAN MATEO COUNTY FOR NATIONAL REBUILDING DAY 2023

On Friday, April 28, and Saturday, April 29, 2023, Rebuilding Together Peninsula (RTP) will celebrate National Rebuilding Day with 20 project sites at select homes and community facilities across San Mateo County. From Pacifica to East Palo Alto, more than 500 volunteers will provide crucial renovations, including painting, debris removal, fence repair, landscaping, and carpentry and maintenance repairs, amongst other modifications and improvements.

Relying already on limited income, "Lidia", a homeowner in Redwood City, had her ability to maintain her home further complicated by recently becoming caregiver to her late brother's children. Asked about upcoming National Rebuilding Day service addressing unsafe clutter, landscaping needs, security improvements, and more, Lidia succinctly echoes RTP's vision of safe homes and communities for everyone: "I look forward to (having) a more secure home".

"There's nothing like the excitement of National Rebuilding Day. On April 28th and 29th hundreds of volunteers will spread across the Peninsula to transform lives. With sponsorship from companies and support from service organizations, local government, generous donors and foundations, neighborsin-need will receive immediate, concrete, and long-lasting repairs and upgrades they could not do or afford to have done themselves. They will also help preserve affordable home ownership and retain the diverse fabric of the communities who need our help", shares Melissa Lukin, executive director for Rebuilding Together Peninsula.

A variety of corporate organizations, including Rambus, Tencent America, Whiting-Turner, and the Woodlawn Foundation amongst more than 20 others, are sponsoring RTP's National Rebuilding Day, providing volunteer labor support and/or critical funding for materials. These partners represent a breadth of industry - construction, technology, retail, finance, legal, and healthcare - underscoring recognition for the positive impact of RTP's work from various sectors in the community.
