



**REBUILDING TOGETHER PENINSULA TO CELEBRATE ITS SECOND ANNUAL
FALL REBUILDING DAY STARTING OCTOBER 12**

*OVER 200 VOLUNTEERS TO PROVIDE CRITICAL HEALTH AND SAFETY-RELATED REPAIRS AT HOME AND
COMMUNITY FACILITY SITES ACROSS SAN MATEO COUNTY FOR FALL REBUILDING DAY 2023*

Rebuilding Together Peninsula (RTP) starts its [Fall Rebuilding Day](#) season the week of October 9, with repair projects scheduled across Thursday, October 12 through Saturday, October 14 at select homes and community facilities across San Mateo County. From San Bruno to East Palo Alto, more than 200 volunteers will provide crucial renovations, including painting, debris removal, fence repair, landscaping, and carpentry and maintenance repairs, amongst other modifications and improvements.

A variety of corporate organizations, including Sares Regis Community Foundation, Stanford Health Care, Provident Credit Union, DPR Construction, nVent, and Roche are sponsoring RTP's Fall

Rebuilding Day, providing volunteer labor support and/or critical funding for materials. These partners represent a breadth of industry - technology, real estate, healthcare, finance, and construction - underscoring recognition for the positive impact of RTP's work from various sectors in the community.

In particular, Tencent America is participating in its third Rebuilding Day project on the Peninsula, continuing to welcome the opportunity to give back to the community in which its employees work. Through a day of service providing immediate and positive impact, Tencent will address needed revitalization at Live in Peace's nonprofit facility in East Palo Alto.

"We're excited for our Fall Rebuilding Day", says Melissa Lukin, executive director for Rebuilding Together Peninsula. "By partnering with corporate, trade, and service organizations, we'll provide critical health and safety related repairs for vulnerable homeowners throughout San Mateo County. The work will not only provide a meaningful team building experience for our volunteers, but it will help preserve affordable home ownership and maintain the diverse fabric of our communities".

RTP is also pleased to continue engagement with local service and youth groups who directly make a difference in neighbors' lives by providing community service on Fall Rebuilding Day projects. Members from the Young Men's Service League (Alpine Chapter) and students from Sequoia High School in Redwood City are scheduled to participate directly on repair and renovation projects.

RTP will host 11 volunteer projects in support of Fall Rebuilding Day in October and into November.
